

The war, so far as the University of Illinois is concerned, is over. The S. A. T. C. and S. N. T. C. units have been demobilized, courses are again arranged on a scholastic basis, student life and college activities are to be restored to their former places; and the Brothers of Phi Kappa, having served in the several capacities for which they were fitted, are returning to Champaign.

The Chapter House at 104 East John street has been leased for the remainder of the school year. Much of the interior has been refinished and redecorated; by January 1 the furnishings will have been restored, the commissary department put in operation, the entire machinery of the Chapter reorganized.
