WATER POLO TEAM GOES TO FINALS! One of the best showings made in recent years by an Alpha Chi Rho water polo squad was turned in by this year's team, which went to the finals for the All-University Championship before being beaten out by Alpha Tau Omega by a score of 2 to 0, on February 21. During the first half of the contest, the chapter carried the fight, taking four shots to the ATOs two, but none of them connected and the ATOs went ahead to finally win.

Two Phi Kappa men, Ruthenberg and Buckle, were placed on the All-University

All-Star team as a reward for their outstanding playing.

To enter the finals, the chapter squad beat Phi Gamma Delta by a score of

3 to 1.

Ruthenberg is the star on offense for the team, having scored ten goals in six games. Other members of the squad are Fred Wilson 141, Carl Mayer 143, Dick Buckle 142, Ted Morris 140, Denny Malcomson 142, and Bob Schmidt 142. Much credit for the team's success is due to Ray Gehlbach 140, house intramural manager. Ray has aroused more interest in these activities than has been prevalent for many years. The entire house has gone to the water polo games to cheer and we were sorry to have the team beaten out in the finals.

The basketball season has just started and to date the team has played only one game, which was won by the lop-sided score of 26 to 16. The ping-pong tournament is now in the third round, and George Troll 140 is the only Alpha Chi Rho contestant left, George Waggoner 140 and Carl Mayer 143 having been eliminated

in hard-fought second-round matches.

SIX MEN INITIATED. Formal initiation was held on Sunday, February 11, at which six men were initiated. The new brothers are: Oakley S. Dorion 143, Aurora; William J. Hunter 143, Aurora; John R. BUM ARTS BALL PLANNED. The Annual Bum Arts Ball is scheduled to be held on Saturday, March 16. The theme this year is really something different—it is to be a "Screwball" dance, with everyone wearing the most outlandish costume possible. A real "Screwball" band will play, and there will be a floor show in which various members will show their "talents". Social Chairman Jack Benard is working hard on the dance, and everyone in the chapter is looking forward to a real good time.

The date of the Spring formal has been set as Friday night, May 11. This, of course, will be the high spot of Phi Kappa's social year, and we wish to extend to all alumni a sincere invitation to the dance. One of the best orchestras on the campus has been signed, and with the early start which the social committee has, the dance should be a great success.

INDICATIONS POINT TO GOOD SCHOLASTIC AVERAGE. The unofficial house average for the past semester is 3.63. This should place Alpha Chi Rho well up in the first five in the social fraternities scholastic ranking. Every effort is being made to maintain this average during the present term, and the scholarship committee, headed by Frank Linder '40, is working hard in keeping check on all grades which are turned in, in order that the members and pledges can continually compare their own grades with the average of the house.

NEW PRESIDENT CHOSEN. Gail Mischlich, who served as president of the Chapter for the first semester of the current school year, was forced to leave his post because of graduation, and Charles Norton 140 was elected to complete the unexpired term. The chapter extends to Gail the best possible wishes for success, and we all know that he will "get some place" as evidenced by his excellent leadership here in Phi Kappa. Gail is now in New York City, auditioning for radio dramatics and announcing.

Brother Norton has proved his executive ability by acting as commissary for the past two years, and everyone is co-operating with him in order to help keep Alpha Chi Rho on top.
