NEW WASHROOM AND ELECTRICAL WORK COMPLETED

Except for minor adjustments and additions to be made, the electrical work and the renovation of the second-floor washroom has been completed.

A completely new shower room was installed. The wall of glass blocks was torn down and completely replaced with a retiled wall. A new cement floor was poured in the shower room and tiled, and new plumbing fixtures were installed-the capacity of the shower room remains at three.

Six new sinks with formica countertops were installed to replace the six old sinks (some of which wouldn't work when they were replaced.) Flourescent lights were added over the sinks and on the ceiling, and new large mirrors were bought and installed over the sinks.

Over semester break, Brother Mike Porter '67, Cary, chipped off the old paint on the ceiling, replastered those portions that had fallen, filled in the large cracks

and gaping holes in the walls and applied a coat of enamel base paint.

During pledge work week the pledge class applied two coats of light yellow enamel paint to the walls, and white enamel paint to the ceiling.

All that remains to be done is to install cabinets below the sinks and cor-

rect some poor workmanship by the plumbers.

The brothers would certainly like to thank the alumni for the work that has been done. The new washroom is the realization of the Brotherhood's hopes and plans for over two years.
