As part of the faculty and student auction at the Red Cross Mardi Gras, various stunt services will be sold to the highest bidder, with the proceeds going to the Red Cross.

The Civil Engineering Department has been officially opened in a new building to house the sanitary engineering laboratory, one of three in the country.

By June 20 all university contracts with fraternities for housing ASTP will have been terminated.

A committee of five members has been appointed to start looking for a successor to Arthur C. Willard who will retire in 1946.

A college of veterinary medicine will be established if agricultural and public health interests will help secure the necessary appropriations.

DEAN M. L. ENGER of the Engineering School has stated that low-cost housing will be a campus and national problem in the post-war era, and reports further:

"The returning World War II veterans will raise enrollments, and there can't help but be a housing shortage. The enormous number of married veterans to be affected by the proposed G.I. 'Bill of Rights,' a measure designed to enable veterans to continue their interrupted educations at government expense, will be interested in low-cost houses for residences on the campus."

The Director of the Library has stated that there will be necessary after the war a one million dollar building appropriation to provide needed library additions.
