⌘ THE UNIVERSITY OF ILLINOIS is in second place in full-time enrollment of students in American colleges and universities, according to statistics compiled by Dr. Raymond Walters, president of the University of Cincinnati, who makes an annual study of the nation's enrollments.

The 27,276 full-time students at Illinois are topped in numbers only by the 40,800 enrolled in the University of California which has numerous branches. Third, fourth and fifth places are held by Minnesota with 27,103; Ohio State, 23,334; and Columbia, 21,590.
