P BROTHER "Bob" Dell was initiated into Alpha Chi Rho at the Phi Kappa Resident Chapter on May 31, 1925. I became National Secretary in October, 1924, and we have been working shoulder-to-shoulder ever since. goes the credit of discovering "Bob" as the National Artist who today, in his 26th year of office, submits his 100th cartoon. I quote from a 1940 issue of GARNET & WHITE:

"You've laughed at his cartoons in ESQUIRE, COLLIER'S, SATURDAY EYENING POST, COLLEGE HUMOR. Now you will laugh at them in THE GARNET & WHITE. If you haven't guessed he is robert c. dell (the lower case is his), our new staff artist. A Phi Kappa, he edited THE SIREN, the University of Illinois humor magazine, for two years until he graduated in 1929. After two years as artist for an advertising syndicate, Bob went to free lancing, and the cartoons and the magazine story illustrations have been landing regularly. His first GARNET & WHITE cartoon will appear in the next issue. It will be a full-page cartoon, full of humor, reflecting fraternity life, on the campus and among the graduates.

"Bob is no 'long-hair' and laments: 'I am very methodical, neat and un-arty type. I still cannot do arithmetic or remember people's names, but I believe everything I read in the READER'S DIGEST, and since leaving school have even occasionally shined my shoes.'"

Only newspapermen can appreciate the research necessary to keep abreast of the times. In no time at all the other fraternity editors began asking permission to use Bob's cartoons in their magazines, including FRATERNITY MONTH.

The cartoons speak for themselves. I truly doubt if any other Fraternity in the country can equal a like gallery.

Bob's keen appreciation of youth; his ability to observe conditions and illustrate them humorously makes him unique in the fraternity world.
