Undergrads Lead in Community Service

Phi Kappa is joining Fraternities and Sororities on over 8 campuses in the Midwest, sponsoring a disabled person from the campus community. Proudly, Alpha Chi Rho is the first chapter at the University of Illinois to join this program. It is called Natural Ties, and the idea behind it is just that. The Greek sponsor hosts the disabled peer from a nearby community whom they have been paired with, creating natural friendships.

Crows' friend is Randy. He is developmentally disabled, and he lives in a home outside Champaign. He has a job and now has a Fraternity full of new friends. Randy is friendly and shy, but if you want to talk Illini sports with him, he will talk your ear off. He comes over about twice a week to hang out with the guys.

We invite Randy to dinner and football games, but what Randy enjoys most is being around the people he knows. Put simply, it just really makes him happy, and that is important. His activities with the house are not only valuable to him, they are valuable to every Brother. The Brothers are eager to see life from a disabled man's point of view, and it is a learning experience all around.

Natural Ties started at the University of Kansas, when a Sophomore in the Fraternity, Sigma Alpha Epsilon, made friends with a developmentally disabled person he had met. He brought him around his house to hang out, and eventually Jay, his friend, had met several members of the Fraternity. After a month, Jay was not only a friend, but he was an honorary member of the Fraternity.

The friendships that Jay formed at that Fraternity were priceless to him. He was twenty-one at the time he became involved with the Fraternity, and he said that they were his first real friends. He no longer felt like he was isolated, or non-mainstream.

Patrick Hughes was that young Fraternity man who was just making friends. Today he orchestrates the organization, Natural Ties, based in Evanston, IL, which has grown from 1 to over 8 campuses in less than five years. Natural Ties gains contacts in the community of campuses with Greek organizations and pairs up volunteering houses with disabled people from the area. The program has been recognized by President Bush as a Point of Light for its efforts in integrating developmentally disabled persons into the university community.

Natural Ties has found an eager sponsor in Phi Kappa. The

Brothers are excited to be part of the program, and they are making friends with Randy. We are even more excited to be the first Greeks on campus to start the program. Our goal is to further foster friendships with Randy, but eventually we would like to help Natural Ties expand their program to the other Greek houses. We are confident that this program is valuable to both the tie and the sponsors, and we want to share the experience.

Another high priority is the physical structure of the house. New fire codes require major capital expenditures in the future in order for the house to meet these codes. These improvements include additional fire escapes as well as a sprinkler system. We have started evaluating this situation and have some preliminary plans draw by a local architect. If you are interested in becoming active with the Alumni Board in any way, please let us know. The board is currently made up of Brothers who have graduated no more than 6 years ago. We would value input from some more "experienced" Brothers.
