

Phi Kappa organizes spring, fall formal rushes

Two large formal rushes are held every year at the University of Illinois. One rush is held during the Fall, and one during the Spring. Fall formal rush consists entirely of students already at the University, while Spring formal rush consists largely of high school seniors. In addition to these two formal rushes, a year round informal rush is also held.

This year, Fall Formal Fraternity Rush ran from Fri., Sept. 26, to Sun., Sept. 28. Formal rush consists of

three stages. First stage runs Friday night and Saturday morning. Second stage is on Saturday night, and third stage takes place on Sunday.

Since there are about 55 fraternities on this campus, it is impossible for the rushee to visit every House. So the rushee must pick twelve Houses he wants to see. From twelve Houses, his choices must narrow down to six for second stage, and three for third stage.
