The family?s favorite place on earth and where they spent their summers was at their cottage (built by Evelyn?s father in 1921) in South Haven, Michigan.

Christmas was a special time for the Barker family. They would gather at the family home in Kirkwood until it became too difficult and then if they were not on a cruise they would meet at the Disney Resort in Vero Beach, Disneyland, Jamaica, and in most recent years the Forum at the Crossing in Indianapolis.
